AGREEMENT FOR EVENTS WITH ALCOHOL

The four licensing objectives, all of equal importance are:

The prevention of crime and disorder Public safety
The prevention of public nuisance The protection of children from harm

No person under the age of 18 is permitted to serve or sell alcohol at any function held at Sandford Parish Hall.

No person under the age of 18 is to be served or have alcohol bought on their behalf at any function held at Sandford Parish Hall

Any person who appears to be under the age of 21 will be asked for a valid proof of ID. These are: A photo driving licence. A passport. A proof of age scheme card, which carries the PASS logo.

No persons to use or supply controlled drugs.

No persons carrying open bottles, cans or glasses to be admitted into the premises. No persons are permitted to take open containers of alcohol or soft drinks from the premises, nor to consume any drink in the car park, entrance or fire doors.

All bottles and glasses will be removed from public areas as soon as practicable when they are finished with. Regular glass and bottle collection must be undertaken throughout opening hours.

No person under the age of 16 unaccompanied by an adult, is allowed into the bar area after 9 pm.

No person who appears to be drunk is to be served alcohol, also no person buying alcohol for someone who appears to be drunk, is to be served.

No alcohol that has not paid tax duty on, is to be sold at Sandford Parish Hall.

Sandford Parish Hall Committee, has a zero tolerance of all the above.

There will be a **30 minute drinking up time** prior to the premises closing when alcohol will not be supplied.

An announcement will be made prior to closing requesting patrons co-operation in leaving the vicinity quickly and quietly; and not to stand around talking in the car park and in the street outside the premises.

An incident book will be kept in the first aid cupboard, situated in the kitchen, and details of all instances of public disorder must be recorded by the hirer.

The signatory of this contractual agreement will be held responsible and therefore liable to 6 months imprisonment and or a fine of up to £20,000.00 if the above rules are not adhered to, in the event of the premises being checked by the police, or customs & excise officers.

Training material can be provided by Mark Jenkins if required.

The Designated Premises Supervisor, Mark Jenkins, reserves the right of entry to any function, at any time to make spot checks, that all the above are being adhered too, and has the right to close the bar and venue if he deems any of these rules are in breach.

Sandford Parish Hall Committee fully backs and promotes The Licensing Law and Objectives of England & Wales.
